Dear Mr. Peret,

Thank you for meeting me at the site today. As I stated, the Department is excited for this development opportunity and looking forward to help the plan become a reality.

At the present, this facility has three metered services and one fire service line. One of the services has a 4-inch meter and serves the sanitary pretreatment buildings to the west of the main building. The main building has two domestic services and one fire service.

Per Department records, one of the two domestic services is metered by a six-inch meter, and the other by a four-inch meter. The four-inch meter will be replaced due to age and condition, and the new one is capable of a continuous flow rate of up to 800 gpm and can register flows up to 1000 gpm. This service is currently off, but could easily be turned back on. The six-inch meter, currently in service, is capable of a continuous flow rate of 1,500 gpm and can register flows up to 2,000 gpm. It, too, would likely be replaced. Therefore, the two services together could provide up to 2,300 gpm of continuous flow.

Assuming maximum flow of 2,300 gpm over 24 hours, this would equate to approximately 3.3 million gallons per day. The Department has treatment capacity of 20 million per day, and the highest day usage in the last 2 years was just over 9 million per day, so there is plenty of treatment and system capacity for the maximum capability of the metered services.
