Approval of Meeting Minutes:

The Commission approved the April 9, 2025 meeting minutes by motion and second, with no opposition.

The Commission approved the March 2026 meeting minutes by motion and second, with no opposition.

The Commission approved the April 8, 2026 meeting minutes by motion and second, with no opposition.

Treasurer's Report:

The April Treasurer's Report, which had not been approved at the prior meeting due to lack of quorum, was approved by motion and second with no opposition.

Commissioner Moore reported a March 31, 2026 balance of \$5,225.81. A \$1,000 deposit was received April 1, 2026, bringing the balance to \$6,225.81. A \$1,000 payment was made to the Majik Factory/NFR Institute

of Technology program from funds received through the Mayor's Office. The ending balance as of May 5, 2026 was \$5,225.81. The report was approved by motion and second with no opposition.

Old Business:

Majik Factory / Training Program: The benches constructed through the program have been completed and are moving to the art portion of the project for painting before being auctioned to downtown businesses. Open enrollment is underway for upcoming trade classes at 1602 Tennessee Street. Interested participants may visit the Majik Factory Facebook page or enroll in person between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Neighborhood Cleanup: Commissioner Milsap presented a map identifying the initial cleanup area bounded generally by Michigan Boulevard, Greenwood, Hendricks, and Woodland. The Commission discussed using \$50 gift cards for individuals assigned to cleanup work from the \$1,000 previously allocated for the initiative. Additional volunteers, including students needing volunteer hours, may participate. The City cleanup trailer and supplies will be requested once a date is selected.

B.J. Ashley Scholarship: The Commission reviewed information concerning prior scholarship awards and the scholarship fund. A motion was made and seconded to transfer \$1,000 from the Mayor's grant allocation in the Social Status account to the B.J. Ashley Scholarship Fund for education purposes. The motion passed with no opposition.

New Business:

Swanson Center Presentation: Esther Styles of Swanson Center presented information in recognition of Mental Health Awareness Month. She discussed mental health statistics affecting African-American men, barriers to treatment, community resources, and opportunities for collaboration. She highlighted outreach through barbershops and salons, including the Confess Project concept, and discussed Swanson Center services such as individual, family and group therapy, substance-use outpatient services, medication management, school-based therapists and case managers, QPR suicide-prevention training, and youth mental-health first aid.

Ms. Styles explained that walk-in registration is available at Swanson Center offices and that financial assistance, sliding-scale options, and help obtaining insurance may be available. She also reported that Swanson Center has been providing support at Michigan City High School following the recent student tragedy.

Subcommittee Reports:

Employment: Commissioner Milsap distributed current WorkOne job listings, information regarding a May 14 Commercial Vehicle Group job fair, and Ozinga employment opportunities. The Commission also discussed significant upcoming construction employment associated with data center projects in LaPorte, Hobart, and Michigan City.

Education: Information was shared regarding a skilled trades meeting at City Hall at 5:00 p.m. and opportunities to obtain training through the NFR/Majik Factory program at 1602 Tennessee Street.

Health: A New Hope health fair was announced for Saturday, June 13, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Mayor's "Move with the Mayor" events were also discussed. Franciscan and community partners are beginning a Shop Talk series at local barbershops and a beauty salon, with the first event scheduled for June 22 at Platinum Designs, 1801 Franklin Street, addressing prostate cancer, diabetes, high blood pressure, and other health topics.

Criminal Justice: Sergeant Corley agreed to serve as chair of the Criminal Justice Committee. He reported that the Michigan City Police Department Youth Leadership Academy is preparing for its 2026 program for students entering grades 6-8.

Social Factors: The Commission discussed participation in the City's Juneteenth activities and the need for the Commission banner, table, and giveaway materials.

Public Comment:

Tommy Kavik provided community announcements regarding upcoming cultural and entertainment events and discussed employment opportunities with the Michigan City Fire Department, including hiring requirements and benefits. He also discussed the City's youth apprenticeship/work-based learning opportunities.

Commissioner Comments:

Councilman Nelson announced an upcoming Westside Neighborhood Association community breakfast at the Hope Center, with doors opening at 9:30 a.m. and the meeting scheduled from 10:00 to 11:00 a.m.

Commissioner Armstrong Sr. reiterated that open enrollment is available at the Majik Factory, 1602 Tennessee Street.

Commissioner Corley discussed fundraising efforts to support the families affected by the recent shooting involving Michigan City High School students. He also reported that the Michigan City Police Department is implementing online reporting for certain incidents where an officer response may not be necessary.

Chairman Pollock followed up on a previously approved donation associated with the Black History Month/Real Men initiative. It was confirmed that the donation is pending and that the necessary paperwork needs to be submitted to the Controller's Office.

Adjournment:

A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at approximately 1:07 p.m.

Approval of Meeting Minutes:

The May 2026 meeting minutes had not yet been received. A motion was made and seconded to table approval of the May meeting minutes until the July meeting. The motion passed with no opposition.

Treasurer's Report:

Commissioner Moore reported that, as of June 10, 2026, there had been no account activity and the balance remained \$5,225.81. The Treasurer's Report was approved by motion and second with no opposition.

Old Business:

Majik Factory / Training Program: The benches constructed through the program remain in progress and are moving to the art center for painting and auction. Additional benches may still be built through the Majik Factory. Enrollment for Core Construction and other available courses is scheduled for June 15 from 10:00

a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The program serves adults seeking career training and also offers youth activities, including 3D printing and chess.

B.J. Ashley Scholarship: No new scholarship update was available. The Commission discussed committee leadership and the need to continue pursuing a scholarship recipient for the current year. Commissioner Armstrong Sr. agreed to chair the Education Committee, with assistance from other commissioners. Commissioner Armstrong indicated he would contact Pastor Hurt regarding the status of the scholarship process and any potential nominee or applicant.

Neighborhood Cleanup: Commissioner Milsap asked about the previously approved \$50 gift cards for cleanup workers. The Commission confirmed that the prior motion authorized up to \$1,000, or twenty \$50 gift cards. The cards had not yet been purchased because the expenditure must proceed through the required City approval process. Cleanup work was tentatively being considered for the upcoming weekend, weather permitting, and the Commission discussed tracking participants if the cards are not available in time.

New Business:

Midnight Hoops: Chairman Pollock raised the Commission's participation in the Midnight Hoops program following the success of the prior year's event. Commissioner Corley reported that the participant combine is scheduled for June 14, with public games beginning June 21. Games will generally be held Sundays from 6:00 p.m. to midnight through August 2, excluding the July 4th weekend, at the Michigan City YMCA.

The Commission discussed sponsorship opportunities and participation through a Commission information table. A motion was made and seconded to provide a \$500 team sponsorship for Midnight Hoops. The motion passed with no opposition. Commissioner Corley will follow up regarding the date on which the Commission should staff a table.

Subcommittee Reports:

Education: The Commission continued discussion of the B.J. Ashley Scholarship. Commissioner Armstrong Sr. agreed to chair the Education Committee. He and Commissioner Corley discussed coordinating efforts to determine the status of the scholarship and identify a recipient for the current year.

Health: No formal health report was presented. Chairman Pollock indicated he would attempt to contact Pastor Johnson regarding his continued participation and future health updates.

Employment: Commissioner Milsap distributed current WorkOne employment information and reported on available jobs throughout the region. He highlighted Integrated Trades opportunities in LaPorte, an upcoming job fair in Merrillville, and NLMK production labor positions with starting wages reported at

\$23.47 per hour and an increase to \$27.27 per hour after 90 days. He also announced an expungement forum in Gary on June 12 from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. intended to assist individuals seeking to address eligible criminal records that may create employment barriers. Commissioner Milsap also reported that the Commission is following an individual referred to WorkOne as a potential employment success story.

Criminal Justice: Commissioner Corley reported that he had no formal report prepared for June and would provide an update at the next meeting.

Social Factors: The Commission discussed the City of Michigan City Juneteenth celebration scheduled for June 19 from noon to 8:00 p.m. at the Washington Park amphitheater. The theme is "One City, One Community, One Freedom." Activities are expected to include live entertainment, music, food, vendors, family activities, a kids zone, and other community programming. Commissioners discussed staffing a Commission table and providing the banner, table, and pop-up canopy. Members were encouraged to assist with the table during portions of the event.

Public Comment:

No public comments were received.

Commissioner Comments:

Commissioner Armstrong Sr. reiterated that Majik Factory enrollment will be held June 15 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and is open to interested participants.

Commissioner Milsap announced that Jimmy John's is expected to open in the Eastport/Eastgate Plaza area and welcomed the additional food option on the east side of Michigan City.

Commissioner Armstrong Jr. announced a free online Creative Brain Boost well-being workshop scheduled for June 18 and available through Eventbrite.

Commissioner Moore announced the second annual June Berry Festival at the Walker Street Park Community Garden on Saturday, June 20 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Commissioner Cooper discussed a Family Advocates mentoring program serving LaPorte and Michigan City and emphasized the need for additional male mentors. Volunteers are asked to devote approximately one hour per week during the school year.

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Commissioner Corley announced that 25 Black Men of Michigan City will hold a "Walk a Mile in Our Shoes" event at Wescott Park on Saturday beginning at 1:00 p.m. The event will include stretching, a one-mile neighborhood walk, and a men's circle led by Pastor Ronnie Gaston.

Chairman Pollock reflected on the significance of Juneteenth, noting its commemoration of emancipation and the history, struggles, achievements, culture, and community of African Americans. He encouraged the community to reflect on why June 19 is observed and on the continuing work toward equality. Commissioner Milsap added comments regarding voting rights and civic participation.

Adjournment:

A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at approximately 12:41 p.m.

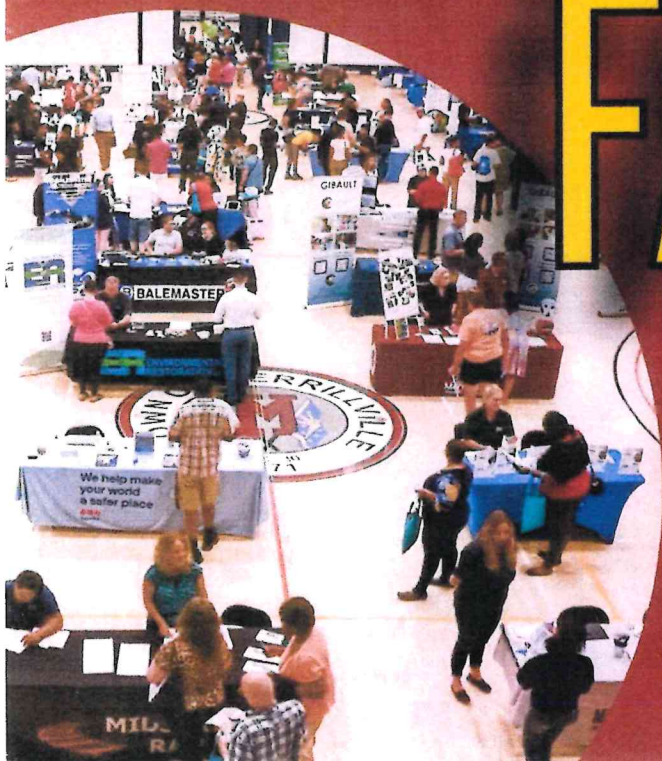
